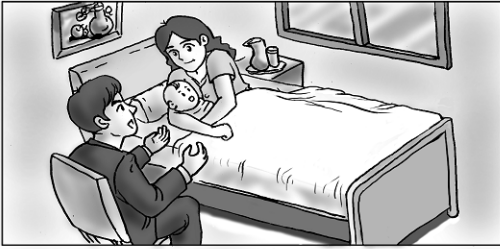

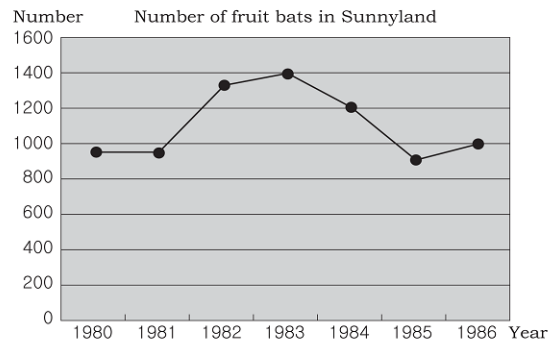

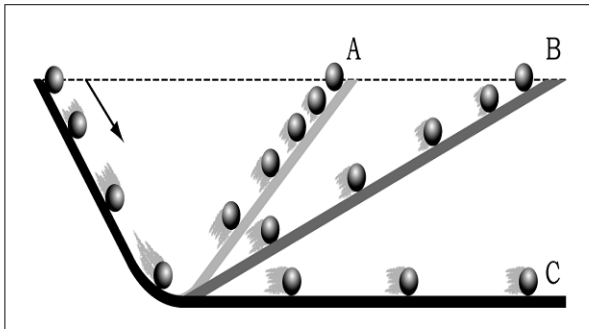

In 1980 the bat population stood at approximately 1000 animals and ② this remained stable until 1981 when the number began to rise sharply. ③ This increase continued in 1982 though the trend was less marked. ④ After peaking in 1983 at 1,400 bats the numbers slumped to 1,200 in 1984. The decline continued in 1985 to reach an all time low of roughly 900. ⑤ The population picked up sufficiently in 1986 to reach a level just over its 1984 figure.
