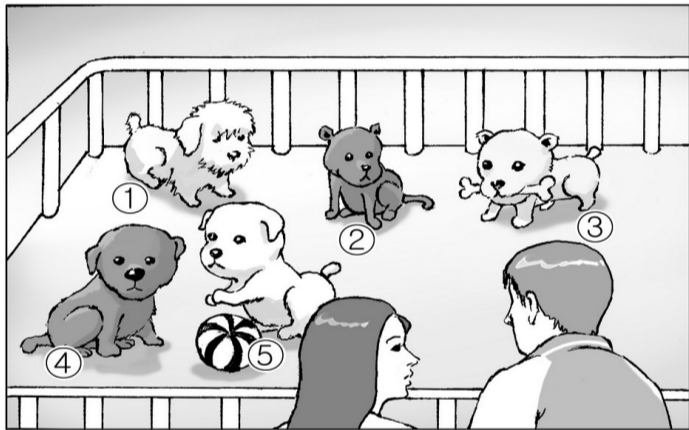

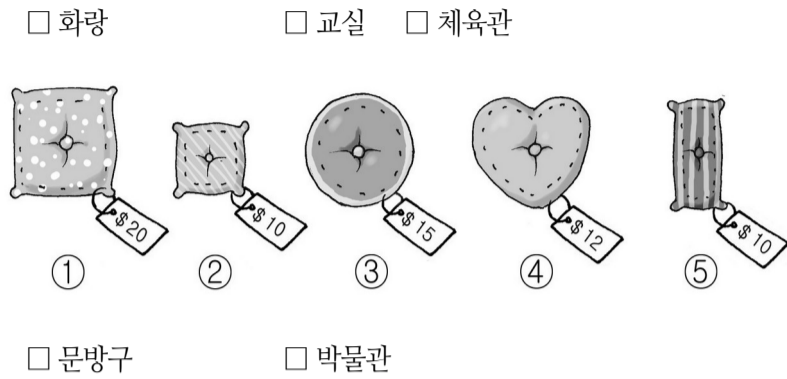

This gets its name from the sound it makes. A muscle in the chest tightens up. Air is pulled into the lungs. The air causes the vocal cords to move. 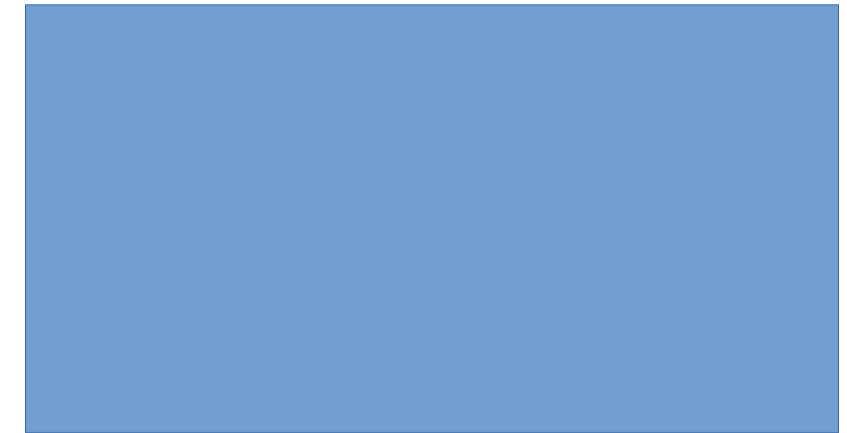

In parts of Africa, wars have been going on for many years. Everyday life in countries such as Sudan, Ethiopia, and Somalia is difficult. Millions of people have lost their homes, markets, and hospitals. In these conditions, food supplies disappear and people face hunger. During the past ten years, international aid organizations have done their best to help prevent hunger by (a) sending food to people in the war areas.

However, this is (b) a short-term solution. Most aid workers agree that giving food to a country in war is only a temporary measure. It may save some people from immediate hunger, but it doesn't change the conditions that lead to hunger. The aid workers say that the first thing to do is (c) to try to stop the fighting. The international group needs to help the warring groups find a way to make peace.

Some international aid organizations are thinking of changing (d) the way they help. They say that giving food can actually help keep a war going.
