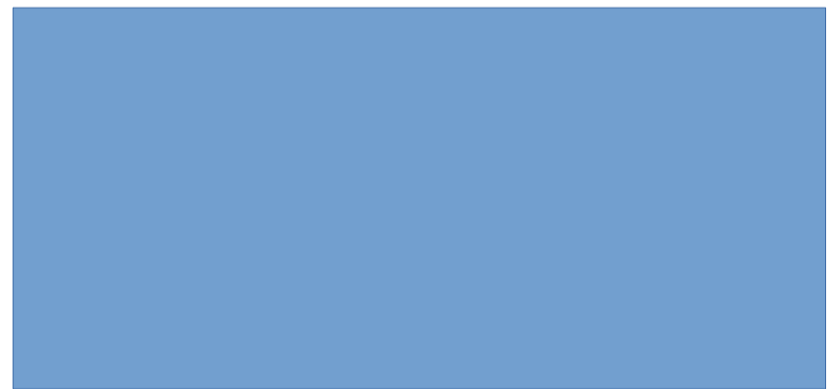

Is the full moon twice as bright as the half moon? That would seem to make sense. But the full moon is really nine times brighter than the half moon. Why such a big difference? The reason is quite simple. It has to do with the moon's bumpy terrain. The moon reflects light from the sun. A smooth surface reflects light better than a bumpy one. Mountains and valleys cause darker shadows. When the half moon is seen from earth, it is the bumpier area of the moon. When the moon is full, there is more smooth surface reflecting the light.

But if this is so, how can we explain accounts from Arctic and Antarctic explorers who, in spite of exposure to very cold conditions, did not catch cold?
