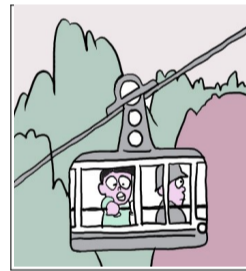

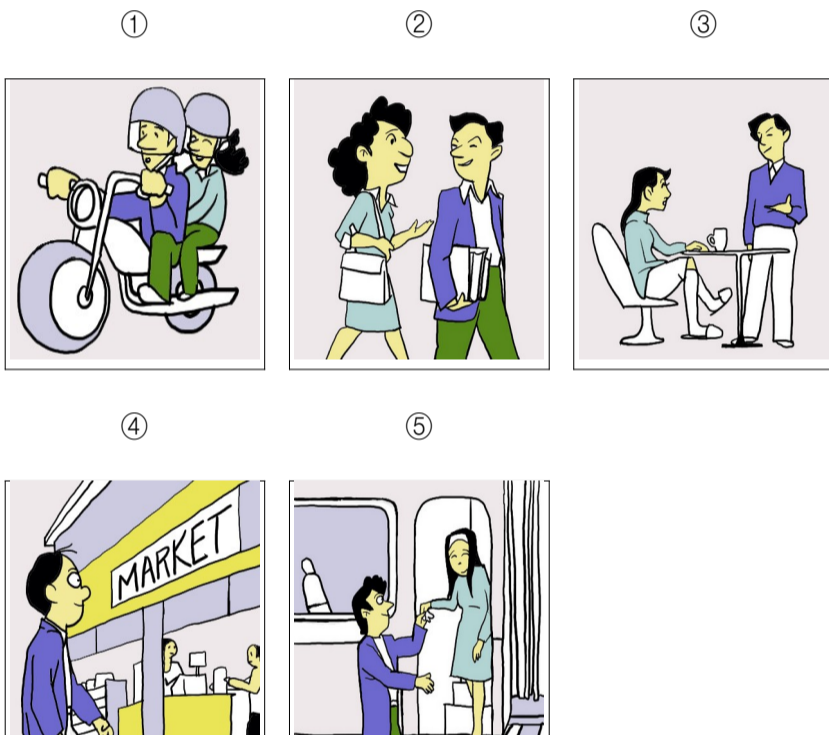

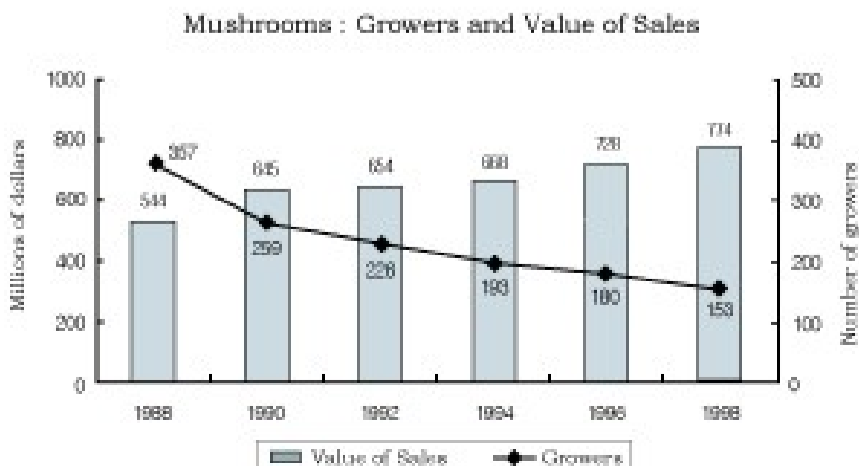

When Tom comes home, he wants to relax by quietly reading the news. He is stressed by the unsolved problems of his day and finds relief through forgetting them. Do you want to be healthier and live longer? Then take some lessons from the Chinese. And stay away from the typical North American diet.

The Chinese eat a healthy, plant-based diet. A joint study found that although the Chinese diet varies from region to region, it generally includes a lot of rice, grains, and fruit. Animal products are eaten sparingly. In southern China, for instance, almost every meal includes a big bowl of rice. People usually eat a vegetable with the meal, perhaps some fruit, and maybe some fish. Pork and chicken are eaten only on special occasions.

The rate for heart disease among men in China is one-sixteenth the rate in the U.S. The rate for colon cancer is only about two-fifths of the U.S. rate.
