0. 대화를 듣고, 남자와 여자가 선택할 클럽 로고를 고르시오. [1 점]

M: The samples of our club logo are finally here. Take a look.

W: Hey, they look pretty good! Which one do you like?

M: I like the triangular one.

W: I like it, too. But why don't we think about the others first?

M: OK. How about the square one or the circular one? Are they too plain?
